Fun Farm Activities

Pre Writing Cards

supplies needed:

- Pencil, marker, or dry erase markers
- Laminator or dry erase pocket (if you'd like)

directions:

Prewriting activities can help strengthen finger and hand muscles that are crucial for holding a pencil and the ability to write. Have your little one trace over the lines. You can reuse the sheets by laminating them, placing them in a dry erase pocket sleeve, or even a zip bag.



Shape Tracing Farm

supplies needed:

- Colored pencils, crayons, markers or dry erase markers
- Laminator or dry erase pocket (if you'd like)

directions:

Tracing is a fabulous way to help children learn the shape of something. For the first time, as they point to the different shapes, you can tell them the name. The next time you can point and ask them to identify the shape. Then when they are ready, they can trace them.

After printing, you can laminate or put the pages into a dry erase pocket. With these options, kids can use dry erase markers. You can also simply give the paper to them with crayons, colored pencils or markers. Kids can trace the shape then color it in if they would like. You can cut out each shape from the blank paper. You may want to have your child color them first. Once they are cut, they can be matched up on the farm page like a puzzle.



Farm Animal Dot Shapes

supplies needed:

- Colored pencils, crayons, or markers
- Do a dot markers

directions:

I don't know about you but my kids love using different supplies, like do a dot markers. Creating shapes doesn't always need to be done with a single line and a pencil. Children will start to gain the confidence to identify shapes, even as they learn them with a do a dot marker or another marker.

Children will follow around the shape, created with lines of circles, with their do a dot marker to finalize the shape with color. Each page focuses on a different shape and highlights not only the shape itself but the name as well. This will help children identify the shape words as well. There are also other versions of the shape highlighted. Children can trace them with any other kind of writing utensil or color them in. For more advanced children, these can also be cut out.



Farm Animal 10 Counting Cards

supplies needed:

- Manipulative of some sort (buttons, pom poms or whatever you'd like)
- <u>Laminator</u> or <u>dry erase pocket</u> (if you'd like)

directions:

Do you ever notice that your children respond better to learning a new topic or practicing one that they have already learned when they are playing a game? These cards are a fabulous activity for introducing or practicing counting, number identification, number sense and even fine motor skills!

I like to laminate or use dry erase pockets for these types of activities so that we can use them over and over. When first learning about numbers and counting, it's easier to leave them in order to also practice number order. As children strengthen their number skills and need more of a challenge, you can mix up the order of the cards. Starting with the first card, I ask my little one to identify the number and read the number word. Next, we place the correct number of manipulatives on the card itself. Finally, if your child is ready you can ask them to put all the cards in order after they have completed the tasks on the cards.




Farm Animal Pattern Block Mats

supplies needed:

- Pattern blocks or cut out blocks from the last page of the activity
- <u>Laminator</u> or <u>dry erase pocket</u> (if you'd like)
- Pencil or dry erase marker

directions:

These mats incorporate multiple skills in one activity. Pattern blocks are not just fun toys. These various shaped blocks can help children with patterns, symmetry and introducing other math concepts. There is also space on some of these mats for children to gain prewriting skills.



I like to laminate each page or use dry erase pockets. If you are prepping this activity for home, you can laminate double sided to save on lamination sheets. Now just grab the pattern blocks (or cut out the blocks on the last page of the activity), get some dry erase markers or a pencil and you're ready to get started. This is great for preschoolers and kindergartners and the fun will mask that they are actually learning!

100 Chart Farm Game

supplies needed:

- Manipulative of some sort (buttons, pom poms or whatever you'd like)
- Laminator or dry erase pocket (if you'd like)

directions:


Cut out the word numbers from 1-100. One way to play this game is to turn the number cards face down on the table. Put the manipulatives in a pile and the game board in front of each child. Turn the number cards over one at a time. Kids will identify and read the number word then grab a manipulative and cover that number on the board. This can go on until the board is full or until the child is done.

Some alternative ideas are: You can set a time and see how many can be found in that time or children could race to see who can find the number on the board first. You could also place the number cards around the room so they have to get up and run around to find them. Then they can run back and place the manipulative on the correct number on the chart. There are many different options depending on the ability and energy level of the child or children.


